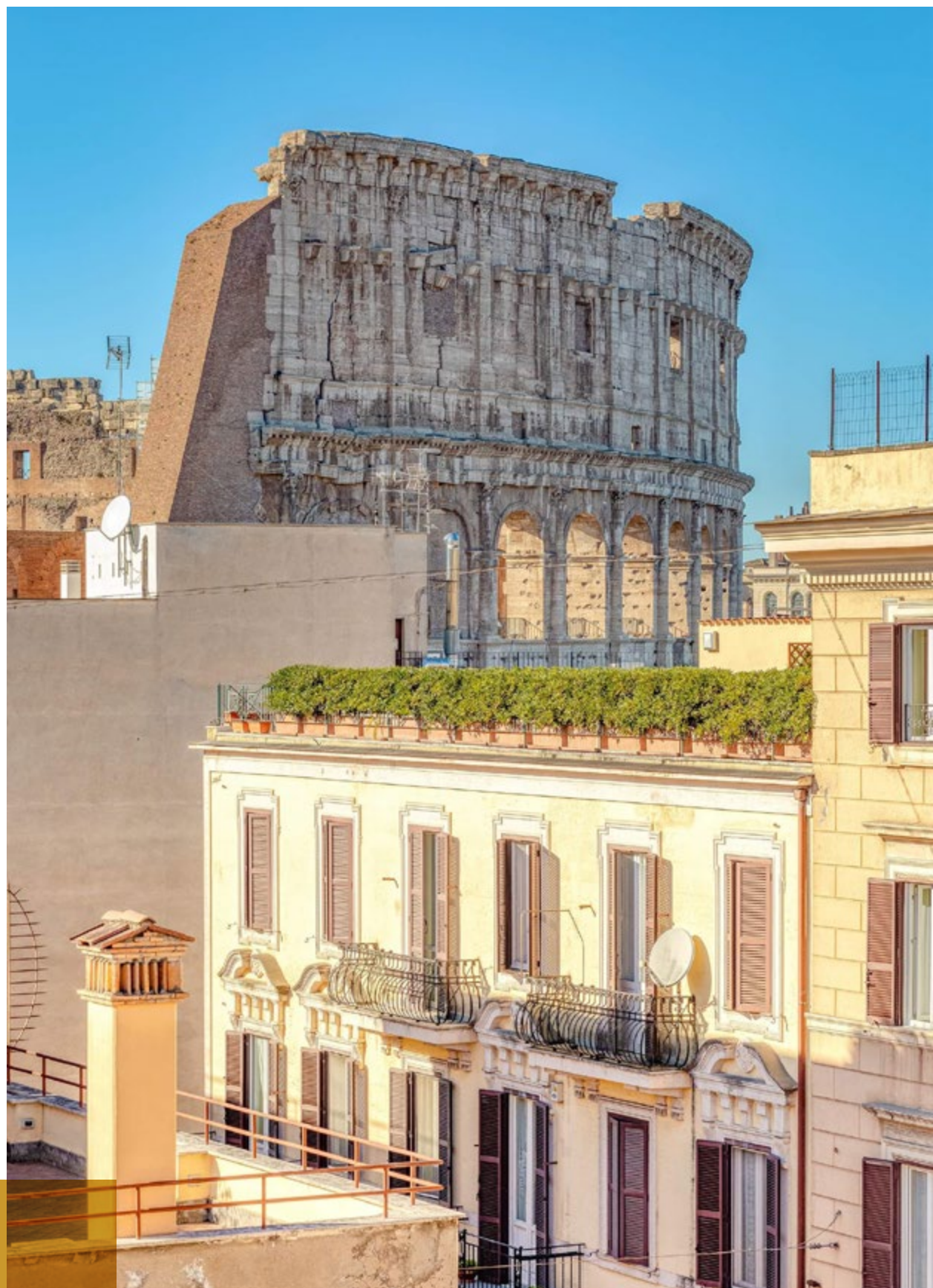

Welcome

The Rome Global Gateway is the research, teaching, and learning facility for undergraduates, graduate students, researchers, and faculty. The Gateway's mission is to dynamically broaden Notre Dame's engagement in Italy and to foster international connectivity by serving as a conduit between campus and other European and American universities. The Gateway welcomes groups from Notre Dame, external organizations, and the local community for events, conferences, lectures, and retreats.







Located just one block from the Colosseum,

the Rome Global Gateway is nestled in the *Rione Celio* (Caelian neighborhood) on the slopes of the Caelian hill, overlooking the Palatine, Aventine, and Esquiline hills. The restored building, which dates back to the turn of the 20th century, is painted the warm yellow ochre typical of Rome's center. Its windows open onto Via Ostilia and two side roads, Via dei SS. Quattro and Via Capo d'Africa.



Conference Space

FACILITIES

The Rome Global Gateway features conference and seminar rooms, as well as classroom space, for academic conferences and events.

Matthew and Joyce Walsh Aula

The Matthew and Joyce Walsh Aula is the Gateway's largest event space and can comfortably seat up to 125 people. The room is equipped with two independent audiovisual systems, two projectors, three monitors, four microphones (wired and wireless), and a video conference system.



Room 108

Classroom 108 is a new and welcome addition on the ground floor, and can accommodate 30 people. The room is furnished with an audiovisual system, large monitor, and lectern.

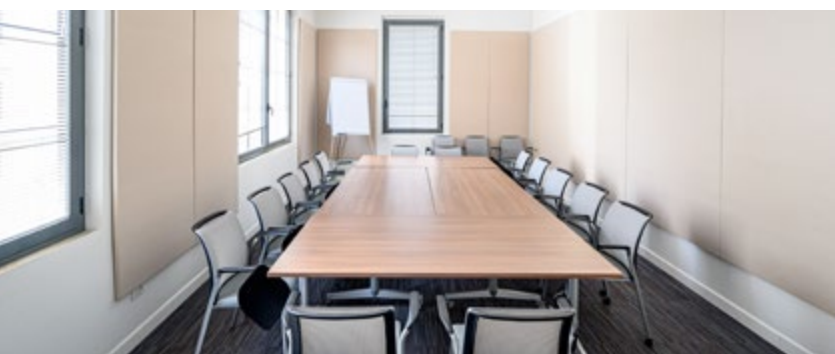
Classroom 411

Located on the fourth floor and one of the most utilized of all Gateway spaces, room 411 can accommodate up to 50 people theater-style or a roundtable of 25. The room comes equipped with a projector, lectern, microphone, and audiovisual system.



Library

Located on the second level, the library is a quaint space for smaller workshops, seminars, and roundtable discussions. The room is equipped with screens and an audiovisual system.



Seminar Rooms 410-412

Perfect for roundtable discussions or meetings for up to 15 people, each seminar room is equipped with a lectern, screen, and audiovisual system.

Social Space

FACILITIES

The Rome Global Gateway offers a number of social spaces for hosting lunches, dinners, and receptions. With an exceptional view of the Colosseum, the rooftop terrace offers ample lounge and dining space, while the Centioli Family Terrace and ground-floor courtyard are

perfect locations for coffee breaks and working lunches. Exposition rooms are located on the ground and basement floors, and offer panel-covered walls perfect for the display of artwork, designs, and project work.



Location

The Gateway's location is in the heart of Rome, just steps from the Colosseum, yet it remains peaceful and quiet. The neighborhood is speckled with Roman monuments and centuries-old churches. It remains lively and mainly inhabited by Romans, rather than tourists, but does offer a selection of hotels. From the Rome Global Gateway, the rest of the city is but a short walk away.

DIRECTIONS

By taxi

Flag an official white taxi from outside Fiumicino Airport Terminal 1, 2, or 3 and ask the driver to take you to Via Ostilia, 15.

By train/subway

Take the Leonardo Express to/ from Roma Termini station. Trains depart every 30 minutes and take approximately 30 minutes to arrive. From Termini, take the metro line B in the direction of Laurentina and get off at the "Colosseo."

By bus/subway

From Terminal 3—Arrivals, bus stall 3 (Bus Station) to Termini Station (via Marsala). From the station, take the metro line B in the direction of Laurentina and get off at the "Colosseo." Walk five minutes to the Rome Gateway.

From Terminal 3—Arrivals, bus stall 1 (Bus Station) to Termini Station (via Marsala). From the station, take the metro line B in the direction of Laurentina and get off at the "Colosseo." Walk five minutes to the Rome Gateway.

From Terminal 3—Arrivals, bus stall 4 (Bus Station) to Termini Station (via Giovanni Giolitti, 10). From the station, take the metro line B in the direction of Laurentina and get off at the "Colosseo." Walk five minutes to the Rome Gateway.

From Terminal 3—Arrivals, bus stall 4 (Bus Station) to Termini Station (via Giolitti). From the station, take the metro line B in the direction of Laurentina and get off at the "Colosseo." Walk five minutes to the Rome Gateway.



Booking

The Rome Global Gateway's prime location and convenient meeting spaces make it an ideal place to host academic conferences, lectures, and seminars, for groups from Notre Dame, other organizations, and the local community.

Services at the Rome Global Gateway include a dedicated events coordinator, audiovisual services and teleconferencing, wireless internet, and wheelchair access to all spaces.

Any requests for hire for public events will be considered but must be approved by the faculty advisory committee and must be in line with Notre Dame's objectives.

To submit a proposal for a conference or event, please visit rome.nd.edu. Submissions should be made at least 90 days in advance.

Additional services:

- The Rome Global Gateway is fully equipped to campus audiovisual standards, but additional audiovisual equipment can be rented at a fee if needed.
- Refreshments are available for an additional cost for receptions, coffee breaks, and working lunches. Offered options include coffee, biscotti, and panini; light lunch buffets; hors d'oeuvres; charcuterie and cheese plates; miniature desserts; and wine and prosecco.
- Photographic services are available upon request.
- Conference packets and folders are available upon request.
